- TALKING ABILITY: BUDGIES ARE CONSIDERED ONE OF THE BEST TALKING BIRDS AMONG PARROTS. MALES ARE TYPICALLY BETTER AT MIMICKING SOUNDS.
- LONGEVITY IN CAPTIVITY: SOME BUDGIES HAVE BEEN KNOWN TO LIVE OVER 15 YEARS WITH PROPER CARE.

BEHAVIOR & COMMUNICATION

Social Birds: Highly social, prefer living in pairs or small groups.

Chirping and Budgies are vocal and have a wide range of sounds, from chirps to whistles. Some can even learn to mimic human speech!

Playfulness: Known being curious and playful; they enjoy toys, mirrors, and interaction with their owners.

Budgies are vulnerable to obesity, iodine deficiencies, & other nutrition-related problems. A well-balanced and varied diet must be maintained for these birds to stay healthy.

Outside captivity, the wild budgie would defeat its domesticated doppelganger without ruffling a feather. Wild budgies are swift and agile, with a slightly forward-leaning posture always ready to take off.

BREEDING

Mating Season: In the budgies breed during rainy periods when food is abundant.

Nesting: In captivity, they require a nesting box to breed.

Clutch Size: 4-6 eggs, incubated by the female for around 18 days.
